

AUTHORITY

The event shall be conducted under the International sporting code of the FIA, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd. (CAMS), Passenger in vehicle guidelines, the Speed Event Standing Regulations, the Non Competitive Speed Event Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any other further instructions which may be issued, and will be subject to CAMS Permit Number 712/1803/01

The event will be conducted under and in accordance with the CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found at www.cams.com.au

EVENT DESCRIPTION

The Light Car Club of Tasmania will be conducting a Club Supersprint event (herein referred to as "the event") on 18/03/2012 at Symmons Plains Raceway over a distance of 2.41km in an anti clockwise direction. The event will consist of 'Observation Laps' (passenger allowed) followed by 1, three lap 'Timed Session', consisting of one warm up lap, 1 (one) timed lap and one cool down lap. At the discretion of the event organisers 4 (four) lap 'Super Sprints' will follow. 'Super Sprints' will be conducted with up to 8 cars starting from a 2 x 4 grid. Once the first 2 cars are a suitable distance along the track a second pair of cars will be started. There will be a maximum of 10 cars on the circuit at any given time. All 'Super Sprints' will be timed over 4 laps and the driver completing the 'Super Sprint' with the lowest elapsed time will be deemed the winner. The event will commence at 9 am and finish at 6 pm.

SCRUTINY

Scrutiny will commence in the Scrutiny Bay at 8 am on the day of the event. All cars must attend and pass scrutiny prior to the event. **Current Club Membership**

Cards, CAMS Level 2S or higher **licence**, competition record and helmet must be presented at scrutiny. Cars must be presented at scrutiny with **log book (if issued)** in track ready condition.

DRIVERS BRIEFING

Drivers Briefing will commence at the Control Tower at 10.30 am on the day of the event. All competitors are to attend the compulsory drivers briefing in the scrutiny bay or other nominated place on the day. Failure to attend this briefing on time may result in the competitors being excluded from the event and the forfeiture of any entry fee.

CLASSES, TIMING, RESULTS & TROPHIES

Class A, B, C, D and E. (as per LCCT Standing Orders) Any class that attracts less than three (3) competitors may be amalgamated with other classes at the discretion of the organisers.

The promoter reserves the right to refuse entry in accordance with NCR83.

Timing will be by electronic means and the Clerk of Course and Event Secretary are deemed Judges of Fact.

INSURANCE

Insurance will be provided in accordance with Appendix I of the CAMS Manual the details of which are too intricate to adequately summarise here.

Competitors are reminded that, by Commonwealth Legislation, it is not possible for any insurance to pay the gap between the Medicare reimbursement and the actual cost of the health care received. If you are taken to hospital you will be asked "is this injury covered by insurance?" or such similar question. You (or your carer, as may be appropriate at the time) must be very specific and advise the hospital that the injury is NOT a workers compensation injury and that you are a public patient (or a private patient if you have private health care).

PROTEST

Any protest must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR

ABANDONMENT, ALTERATION & SUSPENSION

The promoters and the Clerk of Course reserve the right to abandon, cancel, alter or postpone the event in accordance with NCR 59 or to temporarily suspend the event for any reason.

DRIVERS, PASSENGER

All competitors and drivers must hold a current CAMS Level 2S licence or superior and be a member of a

CAMS Affiliated Club. One passenger, who may not be a member of the Drivers' immediate family, may be permitted in each car during the 'Observation Laps'. Passengers must sign the appropriate indemnity form and are reminded that they **ARE NOT** covered by CAMS Insurance. The vehicle must also be kept to less than competition speeds.

APPAREL

Drivers and passengers must be attired in long legged trousers and long sleeved shirts or tops made of a non-flammable material. Suitable footwear is required (no thongs, sandals or high heeled boots/shoes.)

Drivers and passengers must wear a helmet, which complies with AS 1698 (or as otherwise listed in Schedule D of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, and available at www.camsmanual.com.au) at all times whilst on the track.

CAMS ANTI-DOPING POLICY

During any competition, consumption of alcoholic beverages in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition venue under the control of the officials is expressly forbidden until all practice or competition activity is concluded for each day. Any driver or crew member who is found to be affected by alcohol on the day of the event or practice therefore shall not be permitted to participate. Refer NCR 145A. In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Procedure for Alcohol Testing and CAMS Drugs in Sport Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be tested for alcohol or other drugs at any time during the event(s).

VEHICLE EQUIPMENT & SAFETY

All vehicles must comply with section 6, schedules A and B. of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

- a) A Safety Cage Structure in accordance with Schedule J of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport is required for 1st Category (open wheel racing cars) for this event; they are **not required** for other vehicles although the Organisers strongly recommend that they be fitted to all vehicles. Competitors with Safety Cage Structures built to previous or foreign regulations are referred to Article 4 of Schedule J of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- b) Must be fitted with seat belts **and safety harness** of a type listed in Schedule I of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport (i.e. AS2596, ADR 4/00 or 4/01, AS E35, SFI 16.1, FIA Standard 8853/98, 8853-1985, 8854-1991 or 8854/98 or European Standard ECE R16). Competitors are reminded that where required by the relevant standard (FIA 8853/98, 8854/98, SFI16.1), seat belts need to comply with age requirements.
- c) Must be fitted with a fire extinguisher of at least 900g capacity, which complies with AS 1841 and Schedule H of the CAMS current Manual of Motor Sport. (Note that extinguishers complying with AS1841.2 are not permitted) properly fitted at a suitable location. Extinguishers will be inspected by Scrutineers before the event as per Schedule H – 5, this will include inspection of the unit and its mountings for damage, checking the pressure of the contents, and shaking the container to check for settling of the contents. It is highly recommended that the extinguisher be presented with a current inspection tag.
- d) Road going tyres must be in roadworthy condition. Retread tyres will not be permitted (Racing Slicks are permitted provided they are in race worthy condition). Each tyre valve shall be fitted with a cap which effectively prevents leakage. Refer Schedule E of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport for more detail.
- e) Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the CAMS Manual.

- f) All vehicles must be fitted with 2 separate fasteners on any front opening panel (eg. Bonnet), as per Schedule B – 1 of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- g) Any car that is not road registered shall be so constructed that any longitudinal propeller shaft shall be protected from striking the ground, this requirement is strongly recommended for road registered cars, as per Schedule B – 3 of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- h) Be fitted with a return mechanism which in the event of any throttle linkage failure will close each throttle, as per Schedule B - 7 of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- i) All vehicles shall be configured such that the sound emitted when measured 30m from the track edge does not exceed 95dB(A) as per Schedule B – 12 of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- j) Any car that is not road registered shall if fitted with any crankcase breather discharging to the atmosphere, each breather be vented into a catch tank of minimum capacity of two litres for engines up to 2000cc or three litres for over 2000cc as per Schedule B – 14 of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport,
- k) All vehicles must have all forward facing glass, except for the windscreen, covered with a transparent adhesive film, as per Schedule B – 16 of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- l) Display a blue triangle with sides of 150mm on the coachwork indicating the location of the battery or the battery isolation switch if altered from the original location, as per Schedule B – 17 of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- m) Any car immobilised on the course will be removed by the organisers and may be subject to scrutiny (at the discretion of the Clerk of Course) before being allowed back on the track.
- n) All removable objects including jacks, spare wheels, floor mats etc. must be removed from the vehicle cabin, glove compartment, console and boot.
- o) **On-Board Cameras.** Any on-board camera must be mounted in the car at scrutiny and inspected by the Chief Scrutineer. As per Schedule A – 14; Any camera/video recorder of weight greater than 100g and attached other than to the floor must be securely mounted in an aluminium cradle similar to this design.
